Membership: Our Post has achieved 97.17% in membership. If you are an annual member and have not yet paid your dues for the 2023-2024 membership year, please pay them NOW (if your membership card expires before 1 July 2024, you are UNPAID)! VFW Nebraska has set aside more money for \$50 life incentives! Our Post set aside \$2.5K for 50 ea. \$50 incentives again this membership year that's \$100 off the price of a life membership! This is a really big deal – as an example, if you are Under 30, the outright cost of a life membership is \$410. You could have a life membership for only \$310 instead of \$410. But if you are or will turn 71 this year, your cost is \$170-100 for only \$70! If interested, please contact me as the \$ for life incentive will go fast! Help keep our Post, Department and National strong.
